Dear Learners and Parents,

We've had another action-packed term culminating with Eid and Easter celebrations. Spring has finally sprung, and it's been wonderful for our learners to be outside more and see some of the outdoor spaces being developed with planting from last term coming to life.

We have been busy preparing for next year, in particular changes to some of our sites, including getting Jack Clark ready to welcome more early years learners, Roger Cannon ready for KS2 learners and Whitkirk learners moving within the SILC. We've also been planning transition sessions for our Year 6 and Year 11s.

May 2025 will see the start of our GCSE exam season, with learners from Roger Cannon sitting GCSE mathematics and English for the first time. They have been working hard and successfully undertaken a series of mock exams and I am incredibly proud of the learners' resilience and determination to succeed.

Message from Head of School

We have had another busy and exciting term at East SILC Jack Clark. We have continued our weekly visits into the local community and extended them this term to include Tropical World and the Sue Ryder Charity Shop. The children all look forward to their turn to go out of school in the minibus to visit new places and we get many comments from people about how well they have behaved. We are always proud of the learning that has taken place, whether it be paying for things in shops, sitting sensibly in a cafe, or looking at books in a library.

We have been delighted to have Wellbeing with Animals sessions again this term, along with Imagination Gaming and a visit from the Evangelical Church. On top of this we have some new experiences for the children including Book Bag sessions, a sensory story delivered by the British Library and Foot Tech who have been delivering some football skill lessons. You can read more about these in the newsletter. I have to thank the staff for their hard work in organising visits out of school and for coordinating visitors coming into school. We really believe that these enrichment opportunities enhance the children's learning and support with their social and emotional needs and have a significant positive impact.

I am pleased to share some updates about the school site and to let you know that from September 2025 we will have an additional classroom space. We have had the funding from Leeds City Council to change The Hub, which is currently used as a meeting space, into a classroom. The work will also include an additional playground space. We are hoping that the work will be completed over the Easter Holiday and will be used as a classroom from September 2025 when we will be increasing our learner numbers to approximately 70 children. To involve the children in this work, the School Council will be picking the name for the new class which, in keeping with our current classes, will be a popular book character. I can't wait to see what they choose!

It was good that so many parents and carers joined the teachers online to discuss the progress that their child is making. We appreciate that it is difficult for families to return to school to have in person meetings at the end of the day so we are hoping doing this online will makes it easier. To ensure that parents and carers still get the opportunity to be in school we will continue to have at least one school based event per term. This term it was our Play and Stay where the children thoroughly enjoyed doing construction and dressing up alongside their families and friends.

Thank you for your continued support with the fundraising events that are held in school, especially Red Nose Day, where we raised £30.00 and the end of Spring Term Raffle. The proceeds from the raffle will be used to buy play equipment for the summer term including sand, bubbles and outdoor toys.

I would like to wish you all an enjoyable holiday and look forward to seeing you and the children in the summer term.
