

There was an amazing line up of bands/artists, food vans and merchandise with a fantastic turn out of around 300 festival goers, including plenty of East SILC learners and families as well as other young people and adults with SEN. As part of their Vocational Childcare classes, the learners made baby food this term. They discovered what babies can and can't eat and why the food must be blended or mashed.


















Group 3

The time at the centre has enabled our learners a hands-on opportunity to understand the workings of a local business while gaining valuable skills and insight into the daily operations of a working stable. Some of the duties our learners have been focusing on have included feeding, grooming to cleaning out the stables. They have been fully immersed in the responsibilities involved within the centre.



The BBC band (The Bridge Walkers) have been practicing every Friday afternoon to be ready to perform at both the John Jamieson careers village opening and the summer fair.
